

COURSE OUTCOME

Course Description

Building on their work with linear, quadratic, and exponential functions, students extend their repertoire of functions to include polynomial, rational, radical, and trigonometric functions. Students work closely with the expressions that define the functions, and continue to expand and hone their abilities to model situations and to solve equations, including solving quadratic equations over the set of complex numbers and solving exponential equations using the properties of logarithms. The Standards for Mathematical Practice apply throughout each course and, together with the content standards, prescribe that students experience mathematics as a coherent, useful, and logical subject that makes use of their ability to make sense of problem situations.

Practice Problems

Practice problems will be assigned <u>daily</u>. Completion of these problems is essential to be successful. Students must show their work to receive credit.

Make-Up Work Policy

Students are responsible for all tests, class work, and practice problems assigned when absent. Class notes can be found on the class Canvas page. Handouts will be given to students upon return to class. Students should make arrangements within 3 days after returning to submit missed assignments and schedule a makeup test, if necessary. The make-up test will not necessarily be the same test in order to ensure test validity.

As assignments are graded, the online gradebook, Aspen, will be updated at least weekly. Parents and students can and should access current grades on Aspen throughout the semester.

Academic Expectations

Students are expected to come to class prepared with practice problems, pencils, notebook with paper, and a graphing calculator. During class, students are expected to participate by taking notes, answering questions, and asking questions as needed. If a student is struggling, he or she should seek help by asking questions in class, attending tutoring sessions, or meeting with me before or after school. Students are expected to work hard and do their best to succeed.
